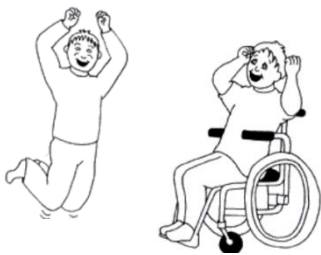




## Camps for Kids

Sometimes you go on a boat.



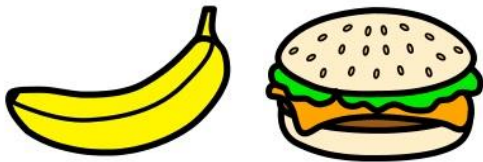
Sometimes you ride on a train.

You sing songs.



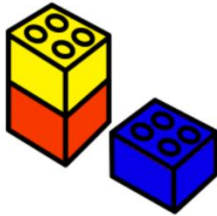
There is yummy food.

How do you go on camp?

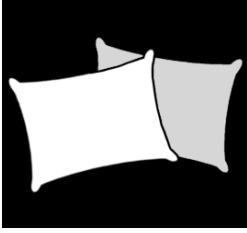


Your mum or dad or carer will ring Cara.

Cara workers will help you.



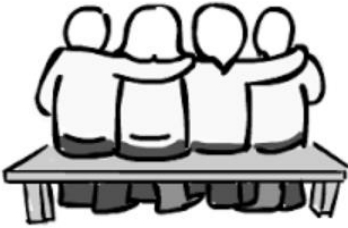
After you have been to camp you will go home on the bus.

How do you pay for camp?

You can use:

- Money from the **National Disability Insurance Scheme.**

We call it the **NDIS.**

- Disability SA money.
- Money from Individualised Funding.
